As I sat down to write this month's newsletter, for a moment I thought to myself, "What can I say that is new, different, and exciting for our very special Nurse's Week month? What can I share that will be inspirational?"

We continue to be challenged in Correctional Nursing with short staff and short supplies, and patients with more complex health conditions, and yet, somehow, we get it done. Correctional Nurses everywhere are doing what it takes to ensure that their patients receive the care and treatment their health condition requires. Sometimes that means being an expert at prioritization (and reprioritization!) and recognizing when the plan you thought you had for the shift is not one that will ultimately get the job done. It demands the use of excellent assessment skills; knowing when to consult with others and having the communication skills to do it efficiently and effectively; and seeing not only the task at hand, but the bigger picture. Correctional Nurses keep the patient first, which is sometimes challenging in our environment where healthcare is not the primary mission.

I am confident that Florence Nightingale, Mary Seacole, Dorothea Dix, Rena Murtha, and other nurses who were our correctional nursing foremothers had many days of nursing with short staff and no needed supplies, but they continued to show up for their patients, and became advocates for patient care, just as I know you do.

So, upon reflection, perhaps I don't need to come up with something new and different to say about Correctional Nursing, but rather remind you of your greatness. We care and advocate for justice-involved individuals who cannot access healthcare on their own. We provide patient education, potentially lifesaving, on a routine basis, sometimes losing sight of the real gift we are giving our patients. We work in places that may be difficult to enter and leave, adding extra time to our workday, yet we still choose to work there. We should realize that if we weren't there for our patients, to administer medications, evaluate them for sick call, ensure that their care is provided based on a provider's treatment plan, and everything else we do, then their healthcare needs would go unaddressed.....but I don't think we do. Contrary to beliefs that are still floating around (albeit much, much less than they were when I began 27 years ago), Correctional Nurses are not those who cannot get a job anywhere else - we are highly skilled and educated nurses who have chosen to work with this special, vulnerable population. 
