Happy Nurse's Week - May 6-12, 2023

As I write this note, I am returning from the NCCHC Spring Conference in New Orleans. It is always invigorating to meet and speak with others who work in our specialty and truly understand the joys and challenges we face daily. I especially like meeting individuals new to corrections hopefully being an example of a career correctional nurse (28 years) will encourage them to consider correctional nursing as a viable career opportunity for themselves! I was also quite happy to hear that many knew about the CorrectionalNurse.Net blog; the Nursing Behind the Wall clinical site, and the Correctional Nurse Educator resources. There are moments when I wonder if they are making a difference, but I heard this past week that some nurse managers are actually using the sites as resources for their monthly nursing training. YAY! Thanks to all for their kind words.

There were many interesting presentations for the 1000+ attendees, but of course, I attended the nursing ones. The Pre-Conference session on Developing a Nursing Operational Strategic Plan was sponsored by the NCCHC Nurse Advisory Council and had over 90 participants, including nurses, providers, and administrators. It was not only a how-to lecture, but we actually divided into groups and, using the skills and techniques just learned (Mission, Vision, SWOT analysis, Goals, Action Plan), developed a plan for our "organization." It was great to see people from across the US and beyond (Guam!) share their experiences and work together. My group was very interactive, and everyone participated. At the end, each group presented their work and received a challenge to return to their facilities and develop a plan for their organization. Mary Muse and Patricia Blair were excellent at presenting the information in a clear and concise way and leading the groups.

Other nursing topics included evidence-based best practices for nursing recruitment and retention; a framework for a patient education project for hypertensive patients; Diabetes patient education; documentation; promoting correctional nursing by enhancing student nursing learning experiences onsite; sepsis; burnout, compassion fatigue and suicide among nurses; nursing management of psychiatric emergencies; and a discussion of Muse's framework for correctional nursing practice. All were very interesting! I am hoping that we can entice some of the presenters to share their work in a webinar for the American Correctional Nurses Association members.

Overall, I am happy that I was able to attend the conference and meet so many correctional nurses. It confirmed what I already knew - correctional nurses are dedicated to their patients, resourceful in their practice to accomplish patient care in an environment where healthcare is not the primary mission, smart and kind!
