

· Debriefing: Conduct a structured debrief within 24–72 hours of the event, led by a neutral facilitator if possible. Encourage all staff who were involved to share their perspective on what happened, identify missed warning signs, and discuss the emergency response. The goal is not blame, but learning and improvement.

 Peer and Counseling Support: Organize peer support groups where staff can talk openly with colleagues who understand the correctional environment. Formal employee assistance programs or contracted counselors should also be offered, with staff reminded that it is normal to feel grief, guilt, or anger after such an event.

Preventing Clusters: Increase observation and communication for persons at risk during the four weeks following a suicide. Consider brief mental health check-ins, housing adjustments to reduce isolation, and clear communication to staff about heightened vigilance. Information about the suicide should be shared thoughtfully to minimize risk of imitation, while maintaining transparency and supporting staff.. This theme ties directly to our newly updated Suicide


